

In this special month we would like to dedicate the editorial section of the newsletter to our beloved Guru Smt. Sandhya Anand.



Students' Scribe The Life Of Shri Thyagaraja Swami

Who Is Sri Thyagaraja Swami?

Sri Thyagaraja is one of the 3 trinities of Carnatic Music. He was regarded as one of the greatest composers of Carnatic music. He is said to have composed 24,000 songs but only 720 have been found. Lord Rama was Sri Thyagaraja's Isthadevatha and the majority of Thyagaraja's songs are about him. Sri Thyagaraja is also known to have the most variety in his compositions in terms of emotion, treatment of ragas and themes etc. Basically he is like Mozart in Western music, the only difference is Mozart lived for a short time But Sri Thyagaraja lived for a long time. He died when he was about 80 years old.

Sri Thyagaraja Swami's Childhood

Sri Thyagaraja was born in Thiruvarur in Tanjore district on May 4 1776. Ramabraham and Seethamma were Sri Thyagaraja's parents.He had an elder brother named Panchapakeshan or Jalepsan . He also had another brother named Panchamanda, Sri Thyagaraja was the youngest of his family. His mother knew carnatic music and was a good singer. He had his very first music lessons from her. From a young age Sri Thyagaraja loved music, sometimes he even wrote small compositions on the walls!!! His father was a good scholar in Telugu and Sanskrit and he taught Thyagaraja these languages. Ramabrahmam noticed Sri Thyagaraja's interest in music and took him to Sonti Venkataramanayya, a musician at the court of King Sarabhoji. Once a week he went near the temple streets and sang compositions on Lord Rama, whatever money he got from the passing people - he gave it to his family.

Sri Thyagaraja Swami's Adulthood

Growing up Sri Thyagaraja never cared for wealth. He did not want to join the royal court; he wanted to live a devotional peaceful life, but his elder brother Jalepsan wanted him to earn money through music. But Sri Thyagaraja did not listen to his brother's words. Once the king of Thanjavur wanted Thyagaraja to sing in his court, he offered Sri Thyagaraja 50m acres of land and lots of gold coins but Sri Thyagaraja refused. He had a small idol of Lord Rama but Thyagaraja treated it as if it was his friend. There are even compositions of Sri Thyagaraja that say that he is angry with Sri Rama. He once went on a pilgrimage to Tirupati but he could not see Lord Venkateshwara. He got disappointed and he composed a beautiful song "Thera theeyaga radha" expressing his sadness. Later Sri Thyagaraja returned to Thiruvaiyar and spent his final years singing about Lord Rama until he finally passed away on January 6, 1847 when he was 79 years old

Conclusion

Today Sri Thyagaraja is as popular as he was 200 years ago. Thiruvaiyar has become a popular place for musicians to go for pilgrimage. Sri Thyagaraja aradhana which starts in January in Thiruvaiyar, India and in Cleveland, USA it starts in April. His legacy carries on and continues to inspire people. Sri Thyagaraja was a great man and has contributed a lot through his compositions and many other aspects.
